Non dobbiamo recuperare il volto vivo di Gesù, che attrae, chiama, interpella e risveglia? Come possiamo continuare a parlare, scrivere e discutere tanto di Cristo, senza che la sua persona ci innamori e ci trasformi un po' di più? Non ci rendiamo conto che una Chiesa «addormentata» che Gesù Cristo non seduce e a cui non tocca il cuore, è una Chiesa senza futuro, che si andrà spegnendo e invecchiando per mancanza di vita? Non sentiamo il bisogno di svegliare e intensificare la nostra relazione con lui? Chi come lui può risvegliare il nostro cristianesimo dall'immobilità, dall'inerzia, dal peso del passato, dalla mancanza di creatività? Chi potrà contagiarci la sua gioia? Chi ci darà la sua forza creatrice e la sua vitalità?

#### A CHURCH AWAKENED

The first Christian generations lived obsessed by the immediate coming of Jesus. The Resurrected One can't be far of. They were living so drawn by him that they wanted to meet up with him again as soon as possible. Problems began when they saw that time was passing and the Lord's coming was delayed.

They soon realized that this delay was deadly. It could dampen their early enthusiasm. With time those small communities could fall little by little into indifference and amnesia. They were worried about one thing: "What if the Christ comes and he finds us asleep".

Keeping awake became a key phrase. The Gospels repeat it constantly: "Keep watch", "Be ready", "Stay awake". According to Mark, Jesus' order isn't just for the disciples who are listening to him. "What I'm saying to you I say to all: Stay awake". It's not a new calling. It's an order for all his followers for all times.

Don't we need to recover the living face of Jesus that attracts, questions and awakens? How can we keep talking, writing and discussing so much about Christ, without falling in love with him and letting him transform us a little bit more? Aren't we aware that a 'sleeping' Church in which Jesus doesn't seduce anyone or touch anyone's heart, is a Church without future, one that goes on burning out and growing old because of its lack of faith?

Don't we feel the need to wake up and intensify our relationship with him? Who but he can free our Christianity from its paralysis, its inertia, the weight of the past, the lack of creativity? Who can infect us with his joy? Who will give us his creative energy and vitality?

## First Reading (Isaiah 63:16-17; 64:1. 3-8)

You, Lord, yourself are our Father, Our Redeemer is your ancient name. Why, Lord, leave us to stray from your ways and harden our hearts against fearing you? Return, for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your inheritance. Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down - at your Presence the mountains would melt. No ear has heard, no eye has seen any god but you act like this for those who trust him. You guide those who act with integrity and keep your ways in mind. You were angry when we were sinners; we had long been rebels against you. We were all like men unclean, all that integrity of ours like filthy clothing. We have all withered like leaves and our sins blew us away like the wind. No one invoked your name or roused himself to catch hold of you. For you hid your face from us and gave us up to the power of our sins. And yet, Lord, you are our Father; we the clay, you the potter, we are all the work of your hand.


